

For Massachusetts, “Risk Management Study” must include instruction in medical malpractice prevention, such as:

- risk identification,
- patient safety
- loss prevention,

and may include instruction in any of the following areas:

- medical ethics,
- quality assurance,
- medical-legal issues,
- patient relations,
- utilization review

that directly relates to quality assurance, and non-economic aspects of practice management.

Risk management includes study of the Board of Registration in Medicine’s Patient Care Assessment Regulations (Mass 243 CMR 3.01 et seq.), but does not include study of its other regulations or its procedures or operations.
