- risk identification,
- patient safety, and
- loss prevention.

“Risk Management Study” may include instruction in any of the following areas:

- A - medical ethics,
- B - quality assurance,
- C - medical-legal issues,
- D - patient relations,
- E- utilization review that directly relates to quality assurance, and
- F - non-economic aspects of practice management.

Risk management includes study of the Board of Registration in Medicine’s Patient Care Assessment Regulations (243 CMR 3.01 *et seq.*), but does not include study of its other regulations or its procedures or operations.
